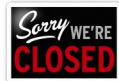

NOVEMBER - OPEN BURNING



Ordinance 2004-8, referred to as the "Open Burning Ordinance" outlines the enforcement, exceptions and penalties of when and how you can burn materials outdoors. Borough Council may at any time revoke permission to open burn for adverse weather conditions. The Fire Chief is authorized to act on behalf of the Borough to permit individual requests to open burn during the months of May and November and also for special requests. You need to contact the Fire Chief each day you burn. The ordinance is available in its entirety at the Borough Office. To contact the Fire Chief, please call 717-324-2940, leave a message containing your address, phone number and date (s) you wish to burn.

ORDINANCE REMINDERS.....

Snow Removal Ordinance

Just a reminder.....snow must be cleared to create a safe path on sidewalks within 48 hours after the snowfall.

Snow Emergency Ordinance

All streets within the borough are considered Snow Emergency Routes. During phase I, there is no parking on all borough streets including state roads. During phase II, all traffic is prohibited on all borough streets and state roads. Snow emergencies can be found on channels 8, 21 and 43. DURING INCLEMENT WEATHER USE CAUTION WHILE DRIVING AND WALKING— TUNE INTO WGAL FOR SNOW EMERGENCY PLANS. REMEMBER TO KEEP SIDEWALKS CLEAR FOR THE SAFETY OF OTHERS. ORDINANCE REQUIRES SIDEWALKS TO BE CLEARED 24 HOURS AFTER CESSATION OF SNOW/ICE.
