It's a busy time in the Borough......a lot of activity will take place in town over the next several months.

Borough Council will bid street reclamation and paving for the following streets:

- Free Street
- Winters Avenue
- Charles Avenue

Please drive with care around these construction areas.



At their July 6th meeting, Borough Council will award a bid for **demolition of the old Ramsay Movie**Theater at 3 South Main Street. This has been a long process, but Stewartstown Borough finally obtained the property deed for the theater in June. The Borough is currently involved in York County's Blight Remediation process in which grant monies are awarded to ease the financial burden of blighted properties such as this.

This was a long time coming, as Borough residents and visitors have watched this once-bustling building slowly deteriorate over the years. The plans for the lot, once the theater is demolished are to be determined.

It's Summertime......please be aware of these important Ordinances to keep our town clean & welcoming—

- 2010-04—Nuisance Ordinance, Section 4—Vegetative Growth—
 - · Weeds & grass that exceed 6" in height is prohibited.
 - Tree limbs, branches, bushes or flowers should not hang over the sidewalk or street right-of-way **unless** there is a 7' clearance on the travel surface.
 - Trees, hedges, bushes, flowers, fencing or other vegetation should not impede the clear sight triangle, 75' in all directions.
- 2010-04—Nuisance Ordinance, Section 6—Pets as a Nuisance—
 - Dogs running at large in town are prohibited. The Borough has an Animal Control Officer who can pick up loose or unattended dogs not wearing a current dog license, current rabies tag and/or owner identification tag.
 - · With permission from a property owner, the Animal Control Officer may place cruelty-free traps on private property for stray cats, that will then be taken to the SPCA.
 - · Animal defecation is prohibited on public and private property. Please clean up after your pets when walking around town or at Hopewell Area Fairgrounds, ball fields & park.
